

Ordinance 2022-09

An Ordinance Establishing Guidelines For Brush And Limb Pick-Up

WHEREAS, The Town of Millersburg Town Council is hereby establishing guidelines for Millersburg residents to have their brush and limbs picked up curbside.

WHEREAS, The Town of Millersburg Street Department will complete area checks. Brush and limb piles will only be picked up on Monday's and Thursday's- weather permitting.

WHEREAS, It has been determined by the Town of Millersburg Town Council and the Millersburg Street Department that nothing larger than a 3-inch diameter and length of less than 8 feet will be picked up curbside by the Millersburg Street Department.

THERE SHALL BE, No logs, sticks, twigs, rocks, or trash. Limbs or branches that are 1 inch in diameter and less than 2 feet long can be placed in the resident's trash tote.

WHEREAS, Shall a homeowner and or resident have a tree taken down, the homeowner and or resident is responsible for all debris and tree removal clean up.

WHEREAS, Millersburg residents can coordinate with the Millersburg Street Department to have limbs and brush picked up that may exceed the 3-inch diameter size and 8 feet length for a cost of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per trip by the Millersburg Street Department.


WHEREAS, A proper invoice will be given to the resident from the Millersburg Street Department. Payment will be receipted into the MVH Fund Miscellaneous Revenue Line Item.

WHEREAS, There is no longer any permitted dumping in the Town of Millersburg for brush and limb piles.

WHEREAS, Storm damage debris and material must be assessed by the Town of Millersburg Street Department to determine pick up.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, that the Town Council of the Town of Millersburg, Indiana hereby authorizes establishing guidelines for brush and limb pick-up.
